



## STAR Events Advisory Team Criteria Family, Career and Community Leaders of America



The STAR Events Advisory Team was formed in 1992 to serve as a support system for STAR Events.

The advisory team is composed of ten members including:

- **Three (3) State Adviser members** serving as the Lead Coordinator, Assistant Lead Coordinator, and Past Lead Coordinator. State Advisers who nominate themselves for the advisory team must be willing to serve in the coordinator capacity and commit for a three-year term.
- **Two (2) Chapter Adviser members** serving a two year term each. The two positions are selected during alternating years.
- **Two (2) Student members** serving a two year term each. The two positions are selected during alternating years.
- **Two (2) National Vice Presidents of STAR Events.** The National Vice President of STAR Events will serve on the advisory team during their year of office and the immediately following year.
- **One (1) National FCCLA Board of Directors member.** The Program Committee Chair Person will serve as the Board of Directors representative for a one year term.

Those individuals interested in serving on the STAR Events Advisor Team should:

- have a knowledge of STAR Events at the national/state levels
- be actively involved in STAR Events at the national/state levels
- be a dues-paying member and/or a member of Alumni and Associates
- have an interest in working to continually evaluate and improve STAR Events.

Responsibilities of the advisory team are as follows:

- remain current and knowledgeable on all national STAR Events
- provide suggestions, comments, and concerns about STAR Events
- provide direction for the future of STAR Events
- serve as possible resources for STAR Events at national and cluster meetings.

The advisory team meets twice a year, in the summer during National Leadership Conference and in the winter following the State Advisers Management Meeting. Expenses are currently covered for the winter meetings; however, advisory team members are responsible for their own expenses to the summer meetings, held during National Leadership Conference.

New advisory team members will serve a two-year term from August 2009-July 2011. The winter meeting in 2010 will be the first meeting the member is responsible for attending. Effort is made to have representation on the SEAT team from all membership regions. The selection procedures follow.

- Student members must currently be in grades 9-11 at the time of application.
- Chapter advisers and student members must be nominated by their state adviser.
- State advisers may nominate themselves.
- All individuals interested in becoming an advisory team member must sign the nomination form.
- Those selected must be willing and able to attend the National Leadership Conference (at their own expense) and a winter meeting during the years they serve on the advisory team.
- Those selected must remain in good standing in the position they were selected to represent (dues-paying member, chapter adviser, or state adviser) for the duration of their term. Members whose status changes during their term or cannot fulfill their commitment to the committee must resign from the team and a replacement will be selected.

Persons interested in serving on the STAR Events Advisory team should complete the SEAT Nomination Form and return via fax, email, or U.S. mail postmarked by May 31, 2009. The form may be duplicated as needed. Nominees will be notified of their selection status in writing in July and the new the STAR Events Advisory Team will be posted online and announced in the August State Advisers' Bulletin and October 1<sup>st</sup> E-Adviser Newsletter.
